# From The Principals' Desk

It is hard to believe that this is the last bulletin for 2018! We have had another fantastic year at CEPS, which has all been due to our wonderful school community. The staff are a hard working, professional group of people who are a great team and are passionate about our school and providing the best opportunities for the students. The students are such beautiful little people who always try so very hard at their school work and with their behaviour and attitude as well. Lastly, our community of parents, carers and friends. Thank you for your support throughout the year by simply attending events and saying thank you or hello, transporting children, helping in classrooms and at the uniform shop and canteen, working in the garden and at working bees. All together we are a team that has made great things happen at CEPS. Our new banner statement (replacing 'A quality education in a caring environment') is 'Inspiring Excellence Together' which I think is a perfect description. I am looking forward to an even better 2019.

#### **Moving Ahead**

As I reported at Presentation Day, we have completed the first year of our 3-year strategic plan. Our directions are Focused Teaching, Engaged Learners and Inspiring Leadership. Some of the achievements towards the targets of the school plan include:

- Implementation of the new Science, History and Geography syllabus
- The development of scope and sequences K-6 in Maths, Phonics, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation, Science, History and Geography ensuring that the skills and knowledge in these curriculum areas are taught explicitly and systematically across the school.
- Implementation of a 5 week data checkpoint to ensure teachers are regularly reviewing their student assessment data and using this to inform their teaching.
- Implementation of the Super 6 comprehension strategies K-6 to improve the students ability to comprehend texts
- Professional learning to build teacher capacity to differentiate learning to cater for the broad needs of students, learning progressions, best practice spelling, formative assessment, integrating technology in the classroom,
- Increased opportunities for students to participate in activities aligned with their interests including a Science Fair, STEM day, Regional CAPA and GATS camps, various sporting events, StarStruck drama and dance groups.
- Increased opportunities for the staff to work collaboratively and improve their practice including peer coaching, team teaching and grade planning.
- Implementation of a whole school assessment schedule and grade based practices that ensure that staff are assessing as, of and for learning.

• Implementation of WALT, WILF and TIB in all classrooms to deeper engage the students in their learning by understanding what the learning intention is, connecting learning to a context and defining the success criteria.

We have seen improvements in our student assessment data as a result of the directions of our school plan. Particular highlights include:

- Exceeding the target of the NSW Premier of an increase of 8% of students performing in the top 2 skills bands in NAPLAN we have seen an 18% increase
- 66% of our Year 3 students achieved in the top 2 skills bands in reading which is above state average with a decrease in the number of students achieving band 1
- The number of students achieving sound and above on their semester reports in English and Maths is consistently above 90%.
- The TTFM student survey results are consistently above the state norm

# **Library News**


It is so hard to believe that yet another school year is almost to an end and what an exciting and rewarding one it has been!














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
