Welcome to Term 4. The students have all returned with a smile on their faces, ready to embrace what is ahead this term. Very soon a curriculum overview for this term will be sent home to inform parents of the content to be covered during the term. We hope that these overviews provide helpful information to parents about the curriculum.

Playground Fun

Whilst our focus as teachers is to teach the curriculum, we also know that intellectual development goes hand in hand with social, emotional and physical development. We also value our positive and inclusive school culture. With this in mind, we have ensured that 'play time' at school is fun and there are lots of options to engage the interests of all students to facilitate the development of social, emotional and physical skills, resilience, relationships, and to encourage creativity. Currently, the options that we have available are:

- Gardening
- Outdoor games
- Use of sporting equipment
- Library

- Lego
- Outdoor drawings kits
- Outdoor construction toys

Soon to be added to this is a nature-based play area. We have a wonderful group of parents who have been active in supporting this in our school. This group and myself met with Niki Buchan, a local early childhood natural learning consultant, to provide us with some advice of how to establish this in our school. From there we have developed a draft plan. Previously we have discouraged students picking up sticks for the purpose of avoiding injuries, but the natural items that we have in our school playground have the potential of becoming great resources for creative play. So this week we have discussed with the students how sticks can be used safely in our playground for building bridges, shelters etc. We have set some boundaries of 'nature items in nature areas' and stick movements should be below waist height and are not to be used for dramatic play. The next step will be to introduce some tyres, small rocks and logs, crates, pipes etc to a playground area that will be defined as the nature based play space. Before this next step occurs, we will inform families of the strategies that the school has put in place to minimise any risk to students.

- All applicants are required to sit the Selective High School Placement Test to be held on Thursday March 12 2020.





High fibre foods include wholegrain foods such as oats and brown rice, fruit, veg, seeds, nuts and legumes such as chickpeas, beans and lentils.



Top tips to increase your fibre intake:

- Choose wholegrain, wholemeal or high fibre varieties of grain foods e.g. bread, pasta, rice, noodles and crackers.
- Fill at least half your dinner plate with vegetables.
- Reduce the amount of meat in recipes and include more vegetables and legumes.
- Have fruit, vegetables, nuts and seeds as snacks.
