STEM

Each term all of our students participate in a DTT Day (Doing Things Together). This is where our students work in their peer support groups and engage in activities based on a theme. This term the focus was on STEM. All teachers planned a variety of activities for the students to complete in their learning space which was lots of fun! On this day also, we were very excited to have Adrian Dawson, father of Hazel in KM, present a talk to KM and 6L about his STEM work with the CSIRO as part of the STEM in Schools initiative. The students were part of an experiment about redirecting light for energy production and complete a podcast. Mr Pat Conroy also attended in support of this event.





Intensive Swimming Program

This year we were able to access the Swim Scheme coordinated by the Department of Education NSW Sport Office. This is a very cost effective option for parents as instruction is free through this program. Places are limited for this, and as the program largely focuses on learn to swim skills, the staff decided to focus on Year 2 as the grade that is most likely to benefit from this intensive instruction. Well done to Year 2 for their huge effort throughout this program and for representing the school with excellence.

Enrolments 2020

Our anticipated enrolment for 2020 is 312. We are expecting that our staffing plan will consist of 12 mainstream classes and 3 support classes. It was lovely to meet our new kindergarten students and their families at the first orientation session on the 23rd October. We have seen them again today at orientation. The Year 4 buddies were very excited to meet a new little friend.

Year 6 Canberra Excursion

Our Year 6 students, accompanied by Mr Lewis, Mrs Turnbull and myself will be travelling to Canberra on Wednesday for the Year 6 excursion. We have a full schedule and some great experiences awaiting us! All updates while we are away will be communicated through the Skoolbag app.

Staff Professional Learning

Over the last few weeks our staff have been learning about the new PDHPE syllabus that is to be implemented next year. Following this, staff have worked in their stage teams to further familiarise themselves and to start writing some units of work in order to plan whole school activities that relate to this new syllabus.

Maintenance Update

The LED sign is ready to install with the final step being the approval of the construction certificate. We are excitedly waiting for this new addition to our playground.

There are a number of projects being planned for our school. We are working closely with the AMU (Asset Management Unit) before work can commence.



Packing lunch boxes for the first time can be overwhelming. Here are our top tips for new kindy parents:



- Pack something from each of the 5 food groups plus water Check out our <u>lunch box builder</u> for ideas.
- Keep foods fresh and safe by packing an ice brick or a frozen water bottle to keep lunch cool.

 Make sure your child can open the lunch box
- Make sure your child can open the lunch box and containers.
- From day 1, make vegetables a habit in the lunch box.
