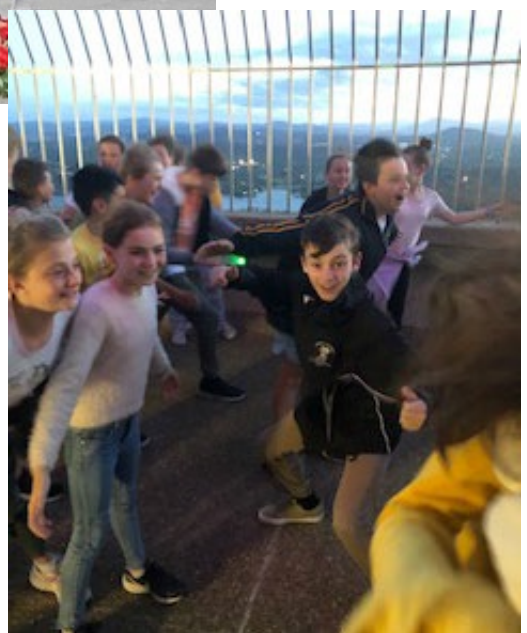

Student Executive 2020

Those students who are interested in becoming a student executive for 2020 have begun their campaigns and have their posters on display in the library window. The rest of the school have been advised to read them and make note of these people in the playground in preparation for voting for their preferred candidate. The process from here involves the nominees being checked by staff to ensure eligibility and then the candidates will be invited to present a speech to the rest of the school prior to voting on Monday 2nd December. The students have been advised to base their campaigns on our Tree of Values. All the best to the Year 5 students who have nominated themselves for these roles in 2020. As all of our Year 6 students are role models to the rest of the school and carry out many duties with a higher level of responsibility, there will be plenty of other leadership opportunities for those students who are not successful. House Captain elections will occur soon after the student executive have been announced.

ICAS Assessments

Some of our students participated in the ICAS English and Maths assessments last term. The students were presented with their certificates at assembly on Monday. Congratulations to Arlo for receiving a distinction in English and Maths.

Silent Disco

Due to the extreme weather conditions last Tuesday, we made the decision to postpone the silent disco. The new date is Tuesday 26th November. All students who purchased tickets for last week will carry over to next week. Unfortunately due to the short turnaround, we are unable to offer any more ticket purchases. A couple of families have prior commitments and can no longer attend the disco. Because the places at the disco are pre-booked and must be paid for, we will be offering these available places to the first six students who bring their \$8.50 (CASH ONLY) to the office by Thursday. This is a first in first served arrangement.

The K-2 disco is from 6-7pm and the 3-6 disco follows straight after from 7-8pm. So that students can get their headphones promptly and enjoy the whole hour, we ask that parents arrive on time. The changeover between discos will be managed differently to ensure that the 3-6 are also able to enjoy the whole hour. Students will enter in the right hall door and exit out the left door. Due to the style of disco, it is not appropriate for younger siblings to attend the disco. We look forward to seeing the students in their rainbow or neon costumes. Remember they only need to bring themselves as free water will be available and there will be no additional items for purchase.

Inclusion Workshops

As our families are aware, we have within our school, three classes that support students with additional needs. These classes are called multicategorical as there are multiple conditions which present in these children. Within our mainstream classes, there are also students who require additional assistance with their learning, behaviour or social skills. At CEPS we are very good at accepting and including others, but to further support the students' understanding of disability, Mrs Atherton has organised the 'Just Like You program' during Week 7 and 8 for students K-6. The Just Like You program is delivered by Variety Children's Charity and is a series of free and fun disability awareness workshops, which aim to build understanding, acceptance and inclusion of those living with a disability. Just Like You is delivered as two separate face-to-face workshops to three different school stages. Each workshop is tailored to its specific year group and mapped to the curriculum. The workshops will occur in classrooms, supervised by your child's teacher. If you have any further questions or do not wish for your child to participate in this program, please contact your child's teacher.

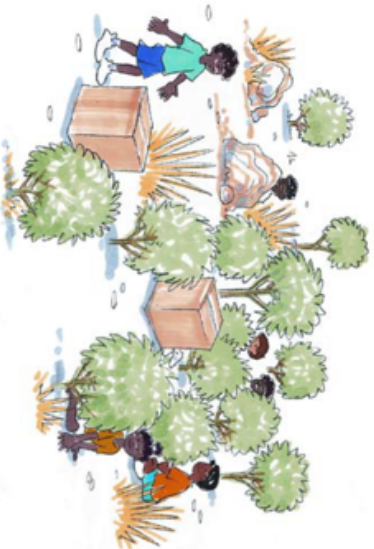
