

From The Principal's Desk

Welcome to Term 4. The students have returned from their holiday break very happy, calm, focused and ready for a great term of learning. School operations continue similarly to what they were in Term 3. School sites continue to be only for students, staff and essential visitors. Parents need to remain off site and remember social distancing rules when waiting at the school gates. The guidelines for some of the usual Term 4 events such as Kinder Orientation and the Year 6 Farewell have become clearer and these events will be organised according to these guidelines. Information will be communicated to families as required. Whole school hygiene practices remain in place this term.

Classes 2021

We have commenced planning the class structures for 2021. At this time accurate student enrolment figures are required to help with this process. We are very close to having the student numbers to form a 13th mainstream class. It is important that we are informed as soon as possible if your child will not be returning to CEPS in 2021 and also if you have a child that will be starting school next year. As our enrolments have surpassed our enrolment ceiling, we are unable to accept any out of zone enrolments unless there are exceptional circumstances. In this case, these will be forwarded to the Director, Educational Leadership for consideration.

Our staff have an expert knowledge of the students as learners and how the different personalities and learning styles of the students work together (or not work together in some cases). The staff put an incredible amount of time in forming the class groups each year. Students are placed into class groups for a number of reasons and achieving the right balance can be a complex process. Decisions are made in the best interests of the students' learning. With this in mind, it is often very difficult to make changes once the school year has commenced. Requests for a change of class once classes have been formed will therefore not be accepted next year. It is important that parents have positive conversations with their children about the new school year and support them to adjust to the new class group and teacher. If you have any questions or concerns about your child's class placement for next year, these need to be put in writing and addressed to the principal. There should be an educational and/or wellbeing focus to these requests.

School Plan 2021-2024

We are in the process of gathering and evaluating data to inform our focus for the next school plan. We will be requesting input from our parent community throughout this term through a number of surveys. It is important that we gain input from families to ensure that we have an overall perspective of where we are at and where we are heading. Please take the time to respond to these survey requests. We appreciate your assistance in advance.

Selective High School Year 7 2022

Information was sent home to all of our Year 5 students last week about the process of applying for selective high school placement for 2022. This process is all completed online. The note that was sent home included all of the information to assist with this process. The tear off slip should be returned to school to inform the school of your intention which will help us to organise the assessment data that the teachers are required to submit. Staff Development Days 2021

The Department of Education released information regarding a variation to the scheduling of the staff development days for 2021. At the beginning of the school year, the staff will engage in professional learning and planning over two days, instead of one. This will mean that students from years 1-6 will commence school on Friday January 29. There will continue to be a staff development day at the start of Term 2 and 3. Students will remain at school for one day longer at the end of the school year and the staff will remain for one staff development day after the students finish. Schools are able to vary the Term 2, 3 and 4 staff development days. If we choose to do this, families will be informed well in advance.

Attendance

Congratulations everyone for working hard towards improving attendance at CEPS. In Term 3 95% of the students attended school at least 90% of the time and provided a justified explanation for any absences. This is a great improvement from the Term 2 percentage of 87%.

Did you know that there is a direct correlation between attendance and achievement. Regular and punctual attendance means less gaps in learning, thus greater chance of academic success.





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

School Travel for 2021



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <u>https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/</u> <u>ssts/updateDetails</u>

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. **Note:** some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

New Concession Entitlement Cards


Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
- Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.
