## From The Principal's Desk

#### **New Look CEPS**

The planned maintenance project at our school is well underway. Last Thursday the asphalt driveway connecting the Wales Street and Ulaka Street entrances was completed. The new boundary fence is progressing well. The James Street side is almost finished and the Bula Street side was started yesterday. External painting around the school has started today and internal painting will start in KT tomorrow. The classes in that block will spend a few days in the library while this work is completed.

The shade sail and artificial turf is finished in the support class playground which looks amazing! This was partially funded by the P&C and grant money.









#### Assembly

Thanks to our clever student executive team, we have a new way of having our weekly assemblies. Each week the student executive visit the classes and present the awards to the students. When this is finished they ring the old bell. The whole school then steps outside their classroom and claps the award winners. This will be a temporary measure until further restrictions are lifted with regard to large gatherings of students inside.

#### **Professional Learning**

The staff have been focusing on building their capacity on the use of technology as a learning tool over the last term. We look forward to being able to utilise these skills in the face to face teaching environment now that the students are back at school.

We are continuing our focus on Visible Learning. So far the whole staff have engaged in two external workshops and the executive team have participated in two planning days. In preparation for these days, a range of data was gathered from the students and the teachers about what good learners are, current feedback practices and learning dispositions. We now have an action plan that will be implemented from the start of Term 3.

#### **ICAS Assessments**

Each year we offer our Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 students the opportunity to participate in the ICAS assessments in English and Maths. These are external assessments developed by UNSW Global. ICAS is designed to target students' higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills. Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition. Every student will receive a certificate and an online result report. Top performers will be eligible for medals and are invited to attend special award ceremonies to have their academic excellence publicly recognised.

This year payments can be made online directly through ICAS using the link below and code 477e1741ab. Parents will need to go to the site, enter their child's name, date of birth and year level (student ID is not required) and then proceed to payment. The cost of each assessment is \$15.95. The parent payment site is open until 31 July. Once this site closes, the school will received a list of which students have registered.

#### Why is it important to be at school on time?
